Brief Background on what are Road Signs and their use

Road signs or traffic signs are signs erected at the side of or above roads, to give instructions or provide information to road users. Road signs are presented in a form of letters, numbers, symbols and arrows. As per above explanation of a road sign, its purpose informs the road user to adhere to legislated road behavioural patterns. Road signs and road markings are the primary and often the sole means of communication between the road system and the road user. Thus a high quality and effective road signage is a key part of the road system. The general policy and sign design principles are laid out in the Southern African Development Community Road Traffic Sign Manual (SADC-RTSM). The manual detail the sign purpose and classification, dimensions and sizes, shape, colour, font and manner of display of the road sign.

Virtually all road signs maybe used in either a **Permanent** or a **Temporary** form. **Permanent signs** includes all road signs used to indicate normal conditions - the *status quo*. **Temporary signs** is any sign that is placed in view of the road users to indicate a change to normal circumstances.

The basic classification of road signs is as follows:

- ***Regulatory signs** - **R** numbering series and generally a circular shape
- ***Warning signs** - **W** numbering series and generally a triangular shape
- ***Guidance signs** - **G** numbering series and generally a rectangular shape
- ***Information signs** - **IN** numbering series and generally a rectangular shape

The SABS National Standards classify the retro-reflective face of signs as follows:

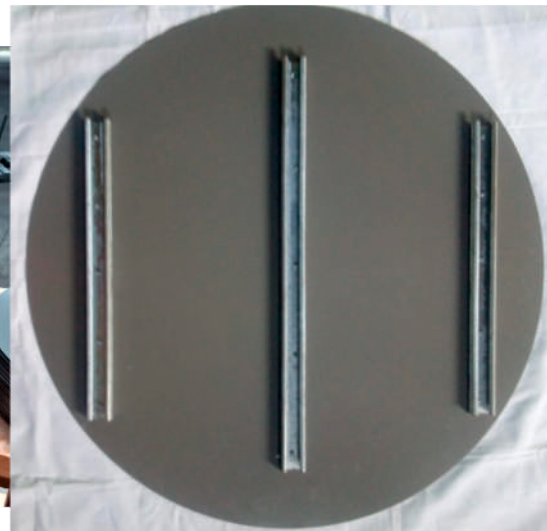
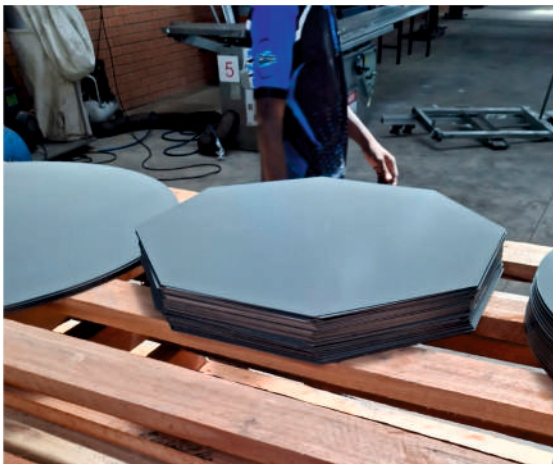
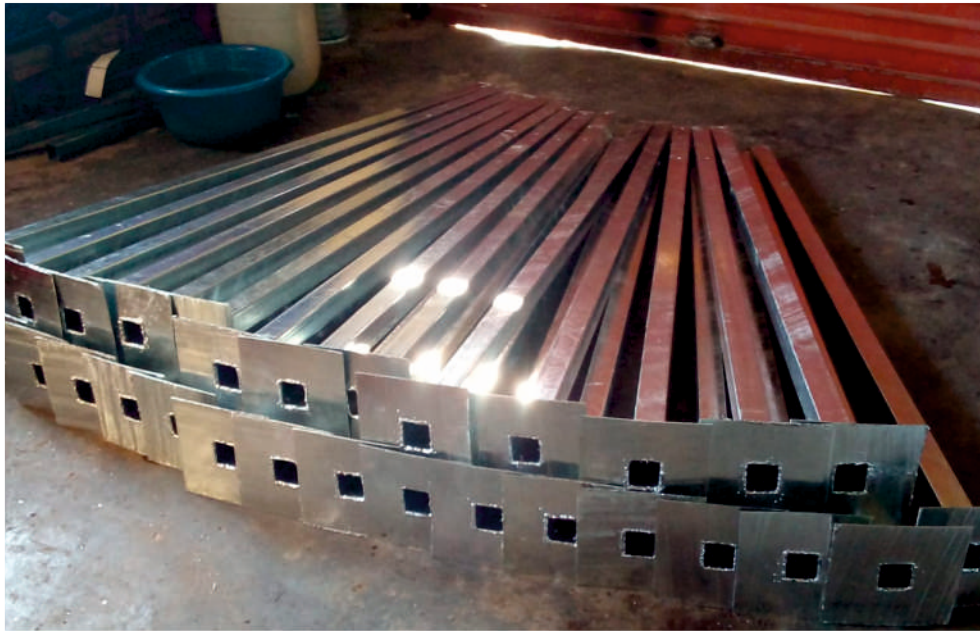
CLASS	RETRO-REFLECTIVE PERFORMANCE	DURABILITY
Class IV a or IV b	High performance reflective material	12 Years +
Class III	Medium performance reflective material	10 Years
Class I	Low performance reflective material	7 Years

The above classification explains the effectiveness of a road sign, meaning that a road sign need to be effective at night as they are during the day. Effective road signs are an important factor when considering a safe and efficient road infrastructure, hence the existence of the road signs manufacturing industry, which through a combination of various materials manufacture the envisaged visual called a **ROAD SIGN**. 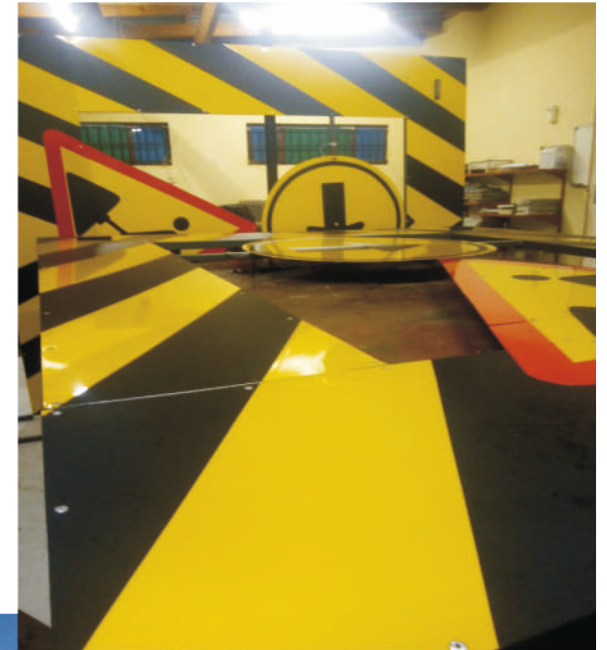

Road signs vandalism, maintenance and care

All said and done about road signs, it's importance to the road user be it vehicular or pedestrians. But a sad factor is that in some instances road signs become victims of vandalism, theft, defacing, accidents, UV sunburn, adverse weather, glued posters and non-maintenance. Also mishandling a sign can contribute to defacing, especially movable temporary signs, for example, during loading or off-loading or when moving a sign to another post/location; it is not uncommon to see a sign dragged face down. The retro-reflective material that makes the face of the sign is a combination of glass beads and plastic, which breaks and tear easy. Non-maintenance of road signs may result into negative effects to the road user.
